SAL BLOWN AWAY AT CONVENTION

The Sons of the American Legion held its annual state convention at Cabela's in Dundee, Michigan. At 2:17 am on June 6, just as the delegates wrapped up an evening of entertainment and collaboration, an EF2 tornado struck. Most of the convention attendees stayed at the Holiday Inn Express next to Cabela's, which received the brunt of the twister. 135 MPH winds tore the hotel's AC unit completely off the roof, broke windows, and even uprooted gas pumps at nearby gas stations.

People staying at the hotel were evacuated to the local middle school and the convention, to include voting on new state officers, was postponed until the Legion convention in Dearborn. Fortunately, our Post's contingent stayed at the Country Inn across the street and about 150 yards from the tornado's path. No Post member or anyone at the convention reported any injuries.

Mark Arneson, SAL national commander and Georgia resident, attended the convention. He later lightheartedly reported that while he was "blown away" by the work we are doing in Michigan, he will stay away from windows here from now on.

FROM THE SAL COMMANDER

We, especially those of us who've had not to fight for liberty as we know it today, might not think about the events that have brought us to our 234th Independence Day. We're less likely to focus on our gifts of free speech, press and religion, bearing of arms, due process, civil trials and fair punishments than parades, cookouts and fireworks. But do we all truly recognize the enormous and costly effort it took to gain these rights?

No, in fact most of us will do little beyond going to work and taking care of family. But we do have a choice. We can extend our responsibilities before and after the flashes, bangs and campfires of our Independence Day celebrations cease. We are free to celebrate our nation's heritage – past, present and future – by honoring the men and women who served to secure our flag and protect the freedom it brings to us and hundreds of millions of people around the world.

We Sons of the American Legion, along with our extended Legion family do that every day. Through our donations of time, effort and money, we bring service to and honor those before us who've selected personal sacrifice in order that we would not. Perhaps you may be asking what more can be done. If I may, I would like to issue a friendly challenge to you and the person you hand this article to after you read it. Don't worry, it's simple: Let's strengthen our Post. But how?

We SAL members can strengthen our Post by recruiting new Legionnaires! That's right, not only can we do it, we ought to be doing it. We need to take a look at our family, friends, neighbors and associates, and ask those who qualify as Legionnaires to join Post 459. Whether active duty, reserve, retired or discharged, we need to ASK THEM! So print out or pick up a few membership forms and put them in your wallet, glove box, briefcase or backpack. He uses the system on a regular basis to keep in touch with his sons currently serving in xxx and
