Meet Michaeline Zagumny, better known as "Mickey", a member of the American Legion Post 459 Ladies Auxiliary for 43 years. "I was introduced to the Post by Shirley Stalic, a nice gal," she said.

Mickey qualified to join because her husband of 30 years, Michael, served in the Army for four and a half years. Mike was a Legionnaire. She commented, "He didn't see any action during World War II, he was stationed in Alaska."

During the years Mickey held the position of "Poppy Chairman" between two and four times. She recalled, "We had 25 canisters among the women. We had about 50 members back then. Some girls took two canisters, when they did you had more to worry about because I would look at the persons name and how many canisters they had. When one didn't show up, I'd be on the phone calling! Now Lucille

Dinkel, she had a beautiful personality. She took care of the Fulton Street Farmer's Market. She would go there wearing her hat holding her canister accepting donations for Poppies. Mary Anne Gill, she was pretty to start with a nice full figure. Her station was Ducks' Restaurant, she was one of the best ones."

A smile appeared on her face as she remembered her Auxiliary days. "On the 4th of July we would all march in the parade from Lafayette to Fuller Park. Everyone had their hats on," she said. In addition, a large poster of Mickey was proudly displayed on the side of her husband Mike's white pickup truck in the parade (see photo-upper left).

Mickey recalled, "Back in 1970 we had a good group, all workers, no scrappers. We held the meetings upstairs. Then the new hats came out. The old ones were round. Each member had a photo taken with them wearing their new hat. We had bake sales. During football season we had big beef stews on sale during the games. Of course Pulaski Days were a big event, we had kielbasa and kapusta. We all enjoyed entertainment provided by Andy Galas."

Mickey didn't always have a carefree life. She was born on St. Michael's Day and received her name in honor of the Saint. Her mother passed away when Mickey was three months old. A Polish couple on the East Side raised her. When other couples adopted her siblings, she was returned to her father. "He was a drunken bum that used to beat me," she remembered.

At the age of 12 Mickey had to work to pay for the cost of coal to heat their home. She worked at a candy store washing dishes and stocking shelves. "One time I stuck some candy bars under the leg of my bloomers. In those days I had to survive. When I was 15, I lied about my age and earned 33 cents per hour folding sheets at Baxter Laundry on Eastern Street," she said.

Now housebound, Mickey has one other brother, Joseph living in Michigan. "I have two sons, Michael Jr. & Martin and a daughter Maryann. One son I don't even hear from, Maryann does everything for me." She went on to proudly say "Maryann competed with 16 or 18 other girls in a Northeastern American Legion Post 459 Beauty Pageant."

Still alert at the age of 84, and a real pleasure to meet, Mickey looks forward to her visits with Margo Forrester. Mickey smiled and said, "Margo will stop by and we will chat about the old times."

As we were leaving Mickey stated, "I'm proud to be an American citizen and a member of Post 459! The Post is a product of our men who were in the service."

August 2nd marks the twentieth anniversary of the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait. The resulting escalation of this conflict is unpopular with many and we witness daily calls for its end. It is worth remembering this date, if only to understand how (quickly) things can change on this fickle little planet.

Our standard of living requires stability. It is easy to forget or even be ignorant to the fact that our national interests – the protection of the means which secures this standard – are continually threatened not only by our relations with other countries, but also by the relations other countries have with each other. We are deeply affected.

Between 1980 and 1988, Iraq and Kuwait were the best of friends, the latter financing the former's struggle with the then growing menace called Iran. Without Kuwait, Iraq had no chance securing the stability of its region, a hub of our national interest. It's important to recognize that stability is not necessarily peace. So when Iraq became unable to repay Kuwait, who then sought other means of reparation, it attempted to settle the dispute by invading and annexing its best friend. And just like that, stability disappeared.

Instead of keeping our nose out of other people's business and allowing our standard of living to deteriorate, we chose to

promote stability – which is often achieved through some form of democratic government. To not have processes that promote stability in regions important to our interests quickly invites disaster into our daily lives beginning with skyrocketing costs and ending with massive job losses that would pale our present situation.

August 2nd is significant because it might do us well to think about the consequences of uninformed judgments and hasty calls to stand down in a world where nearly everyone affects nearly everyone else. Sometimes force is necessary to prevent calamity, even when the danger is unclear or improbable. The point is that it's vital to maintain vigilance backed by the ability to project force, even when things seem to be peaceful or not to have anything to do with us. It's one of the reasons this August 2nd ought to be a fresh reminder of the stability we cherish, respect for its cost and not just a focus on the tragedies that pay to secure it.

By supporting our military and its veterans, we're doing our part to protect the very way we live in this world. It is a tough and complicated 24/7/365 job that these fine men and women have chosen: to serve us. And just like fans at the home game, we make it easier for them to win by showing how

much we care, how much we believe in them. Won't you share the spirit with your friends, neighbors and associates?

It's easy. Come down to the Post for lunch, write a letter to a service member you don't know, bring in some gifts for troop care packages, donate clothes, toiletries or time to the Vet's Home, volunteer for a committee that keeps us going, come to the picnic on August 29, recruit new members, work one of our fund raisers, or just tell people about what the American Legion does. It's the power of one . . . you.
