TAX TIME IS HERE

If you earn under \$42,000 or are over age 60, FREE tax preparation services may be available to you. The VITA Program offers free tax help to low- to moderate-income. Volunteers sponsored by various organizations receive training to help prepare basic tax returns in communities across the country. VITA sites are generally located at community and neighborhood centers, libraries, schools, shopping malls, and other convenient locations. Most locations also offer free electronic filing and will provide service from February-April.

For those 60 and older, the Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) Program provides free tax help. Trained volunteers from non-profit organizations provide free tax counseling and basic income tax return preparation for senior citizens. Volunteers who provide tax counseling are often retired individuals associated with non-profit organizations that receive grants from the IRS.

If you think you may qualify for either program, please make the call before walking in to one of the costly tax preparation companies. Information and local access sites for both programs is available by calling 1-800-829-1040. Both programs are sponsored by the IRS.
