While our Legion currently has many fun projects in progress, one of the most exciting underway today is our Skype Kiosk. The Kiosk (an easy to use touch screen computer) will allow members and guests, through Skype video software, to have a face-to-face chat with their children or friends through the Internet.

The project started a few weeks ago when I was helping our commander, Rex Lambert, set up his new net book computer. Like many of our members, I knew Rex was a proud parent with children in the military. I asked if he had heard of Skype, a way to communicate with people face to face through the Internet. He was intrigued, and we installed the software. Rex mentioned he also had a daughter-in-law, Emily, in El Paso, Texas, and it would be nice to talk to her. Without even a phone call, we searched for her information through Skype, then found and sent her an online invitation message. She happened to be on her computer and responded with an excited 'Yes'! Within less than a minute, the two of them were having a live face-to-face chat across more than 1700 miles and multiple time zones away. The two spent the next twenty minutes smiling and catching up in a very exciting way. During the call, I was introduced to his beautiful Emily. Together, the three of us came up with the concept dubbed: 'Project Emily'.

Our thought was: wouldn't it be nice if we could make it easy for every Post member to contact members of their family in such a fun way, no matter where they are in the world? From there, we put together a proposal, and through several amazing demonstrations, received approval from our esteemed Legionnaires, to move forward with the project. The Legionnaires believed such a service would not only be a nice benefit for our members and guests, but also serve as a way to promote new membership. Soon after project approval, Rex recognized an opportunity to promote our new ability to a large group of families saying goodbye to their young men and women deploying for service. Together with Mark Fairgrave, our SAL finance officer, they presented

- It is **POLITICS** – an exposure to the world of politics with conventions, campaigns and elections.
- It is **GOVERNMENT** – doing exactly the same things and positions as in the real world.
- It is **INVOLVEMENT** – the more a boy is involved, the more he will get out of Boys State.
- It is **FRIENDSHIP** – making life-long friends.

Applicants must be a junior (11th grade) in high school or in the equivalent of an 11th grade accredited home-schooled program, must be 15+ years old by May 31, 2010 and have an interest in government.

THE NEF: VETERANS HELPING VETERANS

The earthquake that leveled Haiti, devastating its infrastructure and changing the future of its people, is a cold reminder that we are forever at the mercy of Mother Nature. All of our technology matters little when a flood, snowstorm, hurricane or wildfire strikes.

That's why, in their wisdom, Legionnaires decades ago created the National Emergency Fund (NEF) to serve as a mechanism to provide for fellow Legionnaires affected by natural catastrophes. COOKIN' CORNER

PEANUT BRITTLE

- 1 C sugar
- ½ C light corn syrup
- Dash of salt
- 1 to 1½ C shelled raw peanuts
- 1 tbs margarine or butter
- 1½ tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp vanilla

Grease baking sheet heavily. Combine sugar, corn syrup and salt in 3 quart bowl. Stir in peanuts. Microwave on High (100%) until light brown (about 8 minutes), stirring once or twice. Stir in remaining ingredients until light and foamy. Quickly spread on greased baking sheet. Spread as thin as possible for brittle candy. Cool and break into pieces.
